The doctor is listening in to chest sounds to determine whether or not the dangerous tuberculosis germs are carrying on active warfare.

Because this disease is completely curable when discovered early and treated properly, an intensive effort is made to discover beginning tuberculosis through free clinics. Over 7,000 examinations of children and adults were made at the Christmas Seal clinics held throughout Minnesota in 1929.
